

Winter Parking Regulations

Pursuant to Village Ordinance, parking is prohibited on Village streets after a snowfall of two or more inches, until snow removal operations are complete. Vehicles found in violation of this ordinance are subject to ticketing and towing. Residents with disabled vehicles should contact the Grayslake Police Department at 847-223-2341.

Holiday Tree Pickup Program

The Holiday Tree Pickup Program will take place on the following Thursday's: January 7, January 14, January 21 and January 28.

Trees should be placed unbagged at the curb or edge of street the night before the service day. Trees greater than six (6) feet in height must be cut in half prior to being set out for pickup. Waste Management will not pickup trees in plastic bags.

2021 Road Resurfacing Program

The Village has non property tax dollars allocated in its budget to annually resurface some streets within the Village each year based on an 18-year plan. By having this resurfacing and financial plan the Village does not have to ask voters for property tax increases to do road resurfacing. From the Mayor...

This is the fifth and final article on your municipal organization and how its resilience has helped navigate the COVID-19 pandemic. Previous articles have discussed how the Village's financial planning has prevented service interruptions and allowed the Village's regular capital program to continue and how past operating cost containment, for decades, has strengthened this capability, how our nationally accredited police department has dealt with the challenges of the current situation through its strong community-policing program, the work of our Public Works Department in delivering services during this time and information on the Village's attention to maintaining its infrastructure as an essential element of community resilience. In this article I will discuss how the Village has been able to assist local businesses during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Over many years the Village has worked hard to grow the local economy. Local businesses create jobs and provide products and services locally. In addition when new business space is built it provides non-homeowner property tax dollars to our schools and other districts providing an opportunity for property tax rate relief for our residents. They are important to our community. The local economy has grown substantially in the last 30 years including in our historic downtown and in the Atkinson Road, Peterson Road and Washington Street corridors. Our local medical services sector, anchored by the Northwestern Medical campus provides vital services to our area. National companies like CompX, FedEx, SAIA and Okabe have joined our community. This larger and growing economy makes the community more resilient in difficult economic times of recent months.

Like across the nation, the Grayslake business community has been impacted by the current situation. Things like supply chain disruptions, challenges to the availability of employees, new operating protocols, and government required operating restrictions have had profound impacts. The Village has assisted local businesses by communicating the latest information on available assistance programs provided by the national and state governments and constant updates on the State of Illinois operating restrictions as they have changed

and evolved during 2020. To date these communications to local businesses number over 15,000 contacts.

While all businesses have been impacted to different degrees, two sectors, dine-in restaurants and local independent retailers, have been especially hard-hit by state operating restrictions resulting in a severe downturn in business. The Village has stepped in, even with our limited resources, to provide direct financial assistance to these businesses. To date this direct assistance has totaled \$220,859. Since April, 30 businesses have been helped through a total of 45 separate payments. We have also promoted these businesses through our social media platforms and, with the Chamber of Commerce, through special promotional events. We have offered options for public space for outdoor dining as well. These initiatives do not come without cost. The Village's sound financial condition, even in the COVID-19 period of lower revenues, has made this assistance possible in 2020.

It is too early to know the full economic impact of the pandemic related restrictions and other operating disruptions. The Village will continue to monitor the economic situation and assist where we can within our limited capabilities.

As we move into 2021, we will be dealing with COVID-19 for some time yet. The Village organization is ready and equipped to continue to provide the services we all rely on. Our police, public works and village hall teams, utilizing the revised operating procedures required by our COVID-19 protocols, are committed to this. Resilience in these efforts is supported by our strong financial status and up-to-date infrastructure. Lets hope more normal times return soon. Be careful and stay safe in the new year.

Best Winter Walking Neighborhood Contest!

When residents shovel their sidewalks, as required by ordinance, everybody's is improved. Help neighborhood win the Best Grayslake Winter Walking Neighborhood contest! Per Village Ordinance, roof gutters, sump pumps, and other rainwater drains are prohibited from discharging water onto any sidewalk, street or alley in the Village. Thank you for your cooperation.
